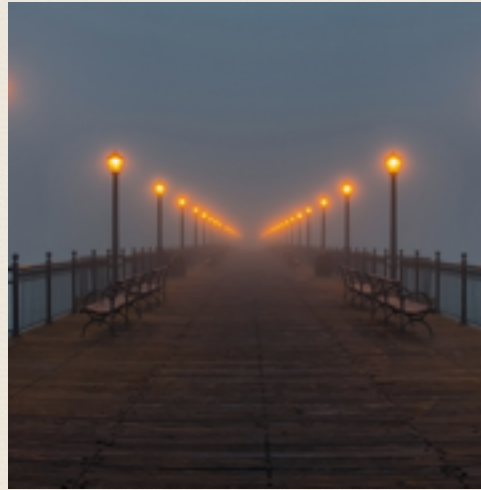
This activity is included also in the “Seminario Interdisciplinar de Grado”, for law students at UMA, Law School.

Michael Thiele is the director of the International Office of the Faculty of Social Sciences of the University of Bremen and academic coordinator of the Geography Department. He earned his graduate degrees in Geography and Education from the University of Bremen in 2001 and 2002. In his thesis he focused on cross border communication and relations conducting research in a village near the German-Czech-Polish border

Michael worked as a transportation planner in Frankfurt and as a researcher for the Center for Higher Education Research in Kassel. At the University of Bremen he teaches the course *Regional Geography of Bremen and Germany* to international students and is responsible for an international module in Social Sciences offered to undergraduate students of his faculty. Outside the university, he is strongly involved in local planning issues concerning education, urban (re)development and public transportation.

Urban and Social Issues in Bremen.

Bremen is a Harbour town with a bit over 500,000 inhabitants in the North-West of Germany. It is the capital of one of the 16 federal states of Germany, the second richest on the one hand considering the percentage of millionaires, but also the poorest when looking at unemployment rates and the quality of education on the other. In this seminar, I will present the recent development of Bremen, especially during the last seven years under a "red-green" government, which supposedly focuses on social and environment issues.

Housing Issues in Bremen

My main focus will lie on urban planning, where major new plans for the future of the city are being discussed in a very participative way, and on a project that was set up to promote second-hand spaces. The latter involves young creative individuals who receive urban space to set up their businesses or non-commercial projects - ideas that were often only possible for squatters in the 1970s or 1980s. I will present some of those projects in temporarily available spaces and I would like to work with Spanish students in order to find out if similar approaches could be possible in Malaga.
